A church is three or more Christian believers meeting together on a regular basis to worship God and is not a cell group of a larger church body.



Sub-districts without churches

Dear Concerned Christian,

A question frequently asked by Christians living and working in Thailand is "Why are there so few Christians in Thailand?" The question is complex and difficult to answer because there are so many aspects to it. However, one obvious fact stands out that helps answer the question, the lack of churches in most areas of the country. The map shown above shows this problem dramatically. The green areas represent sub-districts that have churches. The pink or salmon colored areas are sub-districts without a church.

Sixty three percent of the country's population live in an area without a church. Out of a total of 7,432 sub-districts in Thailand, 5,769 of them have no churches, 40,186,438 people live in these un-churched sub-districts. When you consider that each sub-district *only Protestant churches

How we count Christians?

has on average 10 villages, you can understand the problem even more.

According to Marten Visser's research in his PhD dissertation on the growth of the church in Thailand, he discovered that "People living in a village with a church are almost 100 times more likely to become Christians." (1) Therefore, without a body of Christ in a local village those villagers will have a very small opportunity to see Christ demonstrated to them and to hear the Good News. That is why this is so important.

Another quote from his dissertation that is quite helpful:

'Distance' is the physical distance between the potential new convert and the church. This factor is often overlooked in studies, but is certainly relevant. If a potential new Christian lives 100 kilometers from the church, it is almost impossible that he will hear about the church and become a member. If he lives 10 kilometers away, in most cases (urbanites with cars excepted) he will need a high level of interest to regularly come to the church. If he lives 1 kilometer away, he has a good chance of knowing about the church and knowing some of its members. If he lives 100 meters away, he is bound to meet many of the church members and see the life of the church. So, it is clear that physical distance can be an important determining factor of the likelihood of conversion." (2)

- Please pray that God would raise up many Thai Christians to go to these areas and start groups where believers meet on a regular basis so that those around them can hear and see Christ's love demonstrated.
- Please pray for TEC's (3) Vision 2015 where church members from all over the nation are committing to being "1 out of 100,000 to reach 1 million for Christ by the year 2015."
- Pray that as they are discipled and become disciple-makers themselves that they will go to the areas where the Gospel needs to be heard.
